EU GREEN WEEK BUS

Under the theme of 'Green jobs for a greener future', the EU Green Week (held in Brussels from 29 May to 2 June) focused on how EU environmental policies are creating green jobs and contributing to economic, sustainable and socially responsible growth in the EU. GOPA Com., the communications partner of the Consortium supporting the EASME with implementing the BUILD UP Skills was there and made [this summary](#) of the most interesting parts. On May 31st a plenary session on "Green jobs for the future" addressed the questions of core skills required in a fast-changing job market, where career paths are more complex every time, and how the world of education can help. BUILD UP Skills at the EU Sustainable Energy Week (EUSEW) 2017

BUILDUP Skills was part of the European Sustainable Energy Week 2017. The EUSEW17 conference kick-started with the opening ceremony, at which, Commissioner Miguel Arias Cañete said: 'Energy efficiency is not a slogan, it is one of the most cost-effective ways to accelerate the energy transition.' Dragomir Tzanev, project coordinator of the finalised BUILD UP Skills EnerPro (Bulgaria) and the ongoing H2020 Construction Skills [Train-to-NZEB: The Building Knowledge Hubs of Europe](#) was also there to [present](#) and engaged the audience (in a joint session with SEE Change Net) with the question: Do we have long-term vision & financial sustainability? Also the PROF-TRAC project presented in the EUSEW networking area.

Member States lower their energy ambitions and welcome a move to simplify the energy labelling system

The EU Energy council agrees non binding target on energy efficiency and a simplification of energy labels. This is what the EU's 28 energy ministers agreed on 26 June 2017 concerning the revisions of the Energy Efficiency Directive (EED) and European Performance of Buildings Directive (EPBD). The compromise proposal settled on a non-binding 30% target, which if adopted further down the line would mean an increase on the 20% target currently in force, which is also non-binding. This target less demanding than the Commission and many campaigners had hoped for. Still, the UK, Poland, Bulgaria, Hungary, Slovenia, Slovakia and Romania were singled out for undermining a stronger deal. The full news can be read on [Euractive](#).

According to its authors, the handbook "responds to the growing challenges faced by governments and public clients to stimulate economic growth and competitiveness while delivering value for public money through the wider introduction of BIM."
