Highlighted Case September 2011: Troja block of flats - Case study fact sheet - Eastern region, Czech Republic

More than 80 % of the electricity consumption and more than 50 % of the heat consumption of 650 flats is covered by the electricity and heat produced in CHP units installed inside the block of flats. Electricity from the CHP unit is distributed directly to the consumers through a local grid and the missing electricity is bought from the regional distribution grid. The CHP output power is regulated ... more

UK Government launches £3 million scheme to heat social housing

The UK Government launched a £3 million scheme today for providers of social housing to install green heating systems like biomass boilers, solar hot water panels and heat pumps. ... more

Germany: Subsidy programme for energy surplus houses started

The Federal Ministry of Transport, Building and Urban Development (BMVBS) has started a new subsidy programme for pilot buildings that fulfil the so-called 'energy surplus level'. For the year 2011 about 1.2 million

Euros are available within the programme. The programme will support building owners who build houses that produce substantially more energy than necessary for their operation. The surplus ... more

Kyoto team suspends Romania from carbon market

The Kyoto Protocol committee has blocked Romania from selling carbon credits over concerns about irregularities in the country's carbon emissions data, Romania's environment ministry said on Sunday, 28th August 2011. ... more

First GREEN Certificate of the Green Building Council in Spain

The international association "Green Building Council" has issued, for the first time ever in Spain, the certificate VERDE which recognizes the reduction of the evaluated building's environmental impact by using a standard comparison. ... more

KredEx has issued renovation grants to 115 apartment buildings in Estonia

Within the first six months of the year, KredEx has issued renovation grants to 64 Estonian apartment buildings totalling the amount of 1,848,419 Euros. From September of last year, a total number of 115 apartment buildings have been funded with 2,751,325 Euros. ... more
